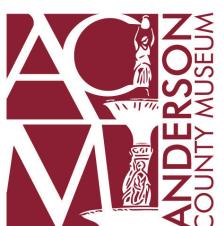

**Bicentennial Art Contest:** Celebrating the 200th Anniversary of Anderson County  
*Youth Art Exhibit Submission Requirements*

The Anderson Arts Center and the Anderson County Museum invites all students in **Kindergarten through 12th grade** to submit artwork for this special anniversary exhibit. Entries may be created in **any medium**, with the following guidelines:

## **Eligibility**

- Open to **all K–12 students** residing in Anderson County.
- Students attending **public, private, or homeschool** programs are eligible.
- **Register for competition by February 1, 2026:**

- One artwork per student.
- Artwork must be the student's own original work.
- Theme for work: Anderson County: 200 years of History
  - May include people, places, events, timelines, industries, government, memorials, or anything related to Anderson County.
  - Must be school appropriate
  - A list of resources are attached

## **Artwork Specifications**

- K–5th Grade: Artwork may not exceed 8" x 10".
- 6–12th Grade: Artwork may not exceed 11" x 17".
- 3-D artwork is allowed, but must be able to hang on the wall. (*No pedestals available.*)

## **Submission Requirements**

Each artwork must have the following information clearly attached:

- Student Name
- Title of piece

- Medium
- Grade
- Art Teacher
- School
- Teacher
- Anderson School District the student resides in (required for all students, including private and homeschooled)

*Please note: artwork submitted for the Bicentennial Art Contest **DOES NOT replace or count as your Youth Art Month submission**. Teachers should continue to submit Youth Art Month entries as usual.*

## Prizes

Prizes will be awarded in the following age categories:

- **Kindergarten – 2nd Grade**
- **3rd – 5th Grade**
- **6th – 8th Grade**
- **9th – 12th Grade**

More prize information to come at a later date.

## Submission Process

- Artwork must be submitted **along with Youth Art Month entries** at the Anderson Arts Center following the same procedure and timeline.
